

## Dear All,

I hope you are staying safe and well during these extraordinary times. I want to reassure you that we are working hard on the arrangements to ensure that your Cambridge experience will be the best we can make it under Public Health England requirements. As part of this work, we will need to determine what arrangements might need to be put in place for you if you have a health condition which means you have an increased susceptibility to infectious diseases such as COVID-19, or a disability (including a mental health condition that can be defined as a disability), which would be exacerbated by living in Cambridge under current circumstances. We are also taking this opportunity to ask you to ensure that you are up to date with your vaccinations.

To start this off, I am sending <u>a letter for you to give to your doctor</u>, if appropriate. It requests their help in ensuring that you are up to date with your vaccinations, and also in providing information to help us to help you if you need additional support. <u>Please do not send personal</u> <u>medical information in response to this email</u>. If your place is confirmed (i.e. your offer is currently unconditional, or is made unconditional following receipt of examination results in the coming weeks), then your College will be in touch with you in August to follow up on this. Further advice is available on the <u>University website</u>.

In the meantime, I recommend you regularly check the <u>admissions webpage</u> for up to date information.
