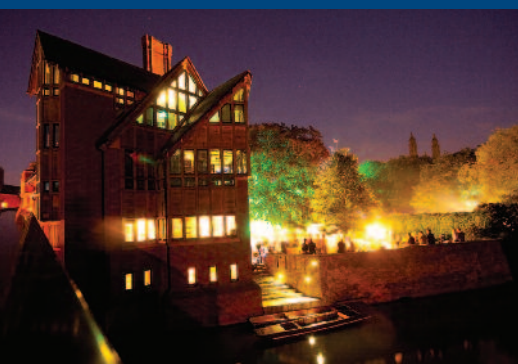
Thinking about higher education?

The University of Cambridge welcomes applications from mature students who want to commit to a full-time course with the same demands, opportunities and facilities that our other undergraduates experience.



Did you know?

- The University of Cambridge has four Colleges exclusively for students aged 21 or older (although mature students may apply to any of the 29 undergraduate Colleges).
- While the standard application deadline for Cambridge is **15 October**, there's a second application round for those applying to one of the mature Colleges for some courses*, the deadline for which is **1 March**.
- The University offers financial support to many students, including mature undergraduates, and additional hardship funds may be available should your financial circumstances change unexpectedly during your studies.
- Cambridge provides excellent academic and pastoral support for students, and has one of the highest retention rates in the country – just one per cent of students leave before they graduate (compared to a national average of around seven per cent).
- All undergraduate degrees at Cambridge are full-time, and students must live in the city during term-time. However, most undergraduates are guaranteed College-owned accommodation for three years and some Colleges are able to provide family accommodation.

Who are we looking for?

- Students from **all** backgrounds are welcome to apply and mature applicants are expected to achieve the same academic standards in their equivalent qualifications as school leavers.
- You must have undertaken some academic study in the two years before applying, and must hold a Level 3 qualification.
- Access to HE Diplomas are a recognised entry route to many of our courses (although some courses may require additional qualifications).
